ADMISSIONS POLICY

When considering which children of school age, should be selected for admission, the Board of Governors will only take into account information which is detailed on the application or provided directly to the school. Parents should therefore ensure that all information pertaining to their child and relevant to the school's admissions criteria is stated on the application or provided directly to the school, example – eldest child.

Criteria will be applied in the order set down to all applications prior to enrolment and before any other transfer from another school:

- 1. Children from Killeeshil Parish.
- 2. Children who will have a brother/sister, half-brother/half-sister in attendance in the current school year.
- 3. Children whose brother/sister, half-brother/half-sister previously completed at least 3 academic years in St Mary's Primary School Cabragh (name(s) and dates attended must be stated on the application form).
- 4. Children who are the eldest in the family, whose parent(s) grandparent(s) previously completed at least 3 academic years in a primary school in Killeeshil Parish, school, name(s) and dates attended must be stated on the application form).
- 5. Children of employees of St Mary's Primary School, Cabragh.
- 6. Children who are the eldest in the family or the first child in the family eligible for mainstream education or an only child.
- 7. Children of compulsory school age from other areas.

Tie Breaker

If St Mary's is still oversubscribed after applying the last criteria, remaining places will be allotted on the basis of the proximity of the child's home to the school based on the closeness of home to school as measured by Google Maps UK, using the A to B tool.



ADMISSIONS POLICY

Duty To Verify

The Board of Governors reserves the right to require such supplementary evidence as it may determine to support or verify information on any application. If the requested evidence is not provided to the Board of Governors by the deadline given, this will result in the withdrawal of an offer of a place. Similarly, if information is supplied which appears to be false or misleading in any material way, the offer of a place will be withdrawn.

Waiting List Policy

The school does not operate a Waiting List Policy.

Admission to Primary 2 - Primary 7

Admission to these classes will be based on the above criteria provided that such an admission does not prejudice or threaten the efficient use of school's resources and subject to a reasonable and manageable upper limit on the number of pupils any one teacher has to cater for.

CURRICULUM

It is the policy of the Board of Governors, that the school will implement and deliver the Northern Ireland Curriculum, having regard to the needs, experience, interests, aptitudes and stage of development of the pupils together with the resources both human and physical, available to the school.

The Northern Ireland Curriculum aims to empower young people to develop their potential and to make informed and responsible choices and decisions throughout their lives. The learning opportunities provided through the Northern Ireland Curriculum should help young people to develop as individuals, contributors to society and contributors to the economy and the environment. At the heart of the curriculum is the development of skills and capabilities for lifelong learning and for operating effectively in society.

There are now three distinct stages covered from 4-11 years:

Foundation Stage: P1 & P2

Key Stage One: P3 & P4

Key Stage Two: P5, P6 & P7





CURRICULUM

The curriculum for the three stages is set out in 'Areas of Learning.'

These areas are:

- 1. Language and Literacy (including Talking and Listening, Reading and Writing)
- 2. <u>Mathematics and Numeracy</u> (focusing on the development of mathematical concepts and numeracy across the curriculum)
- 3. The Arts (including Art and Design, Drama and Music)
- 4. <u>The World Around Us</u> (focusing on the development of knowledge, skills and understanding in Geography, History and Science and Technology)
- 5. <u>Personal Development and Mutual Understanding</u> (focusing on emotional development, social skills, learning to learn, health, relationships and mutual understanding in the local and global community)
- 6. <u>Physical Education</u> (focusing on the development of knowledge, skills and understanding through play and a range of physical activities)
- 7. Religious Education (focusing on faith development, including biblical stories)





LANGUAGE AND LITERACY

Language and Literacy is taught through the three main areas of talking and listening, reading and writing. Literacy is key to learning and so we focus on developing your child's ability to understand and use language appropriately. We strive to ensure that each pupil can express themselves creatively, communicate confidently and interact effectively with others.

We employ a range of approaches and strategies to develop and support our pupils' literacy skills. We use Linguistic Phonics to help pupils learn about and use their knowledge of sounds in words.









MATHEMATICS AND NUMERACY

In St. Mary's, mathematical ideas are developed by making use of practical materials and electronic resources and by exploring various mathematical processes. Stimulating activities are provided for your child in the areas of 'Number', 'Measures', 'Shape and Space' and 'Handling Data'. Our pupils also engage in a wide range of purposeful, problem-solving activities which involve them in different modes of mathematical learning, including playing, exploring and investigating, doing and observing, talking and listening, asking questions, reflecting, drafting, reading and recording.









WORLD AROUND US

We believe that children are innately imaginative and creative and so these dispositions are valued and nurtured in St. Mary's by providing your child with exciting and relevant contexts for their learning. Children learn about how things work and about the characteristics of the natural world, through investigation and discovery. We provide pupils with opportunities to ask questions about themselves and the nature of the world around them.









THE ARTS

In St. Mary's, creativity is developed through every area of the curriculum and is closely linked with all aspects of learning.

Art and Design, Drama and Music – known as 'The Arts' – provide many opportunities for developing this creativity. Pupils are encouraged to express their ideas and feelings in a variety of ways with the aim that their individuality, imagination and creativity develop during their years in primary school.









PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The purpose of Physical Education is to provide the opportunity for specific attention to be given to the physical development, health and well-being of your child. Children experience a sense of fun, enjoyment and achievement through a variety of progressively challenging activities in P.E. Children develop a variety of physical skills and are encouraged to participate in many individual and team sports including Dance, Gymnastics, Athletics, Games and Swimming.











PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT AND MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING

Through our outstanding level of pastoral care and through a variety of learning experiences, pupils are encouraged to develop their self-confidence and ,selfesteem, to think about moral values and to develop their personal and interpersonal skills. 'Personal Development and Mutual Understanding', as a distinct Area of Learning, focuses on encouraging your child to become personally, emotionally, and socially effective, to lead healthy, safe, and fulfilled lives and to become confident, independent, and responsible citizens.









RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

We aim to develop the distinctive Catholic ethos of our school, to enrich the spiritual and moral development of your child and to foster links with the Parish of Killeeshil. We assist parents in preparing children for the Sacraments of Penance, Eucharist and Confirmation, recognising that parents are key educators of their children – particularly in the areas of faith and religion. We endeavour to develop each child's sense of confidence in his/her own identity and an understanding and respect for traditions other than his/her own. Catholic Education is the centre point of the entire child's personal and intellectual development. The Religious Education of the pupils is accomplished in two equally important and complementary ways:

- Through the totality of experience in the school.
- Through the Grow in Love Religious Education Programme.

The staff are aware of the spiritual needs of the children and of the important role Religious Education plays in a child's upbringing. With assistance and encouragement from our Parish Priest, Fr. Hannigan, we ensure that these needs are catered for. Parents have a right of withdrawal from all of RE or part of RE.









ASSESSING YOUR CHILD'S PROGRESS

Assessment is an integral part of the learning process. The school will monitor your child's progress carefully through a range of assessment techniques and strategies.

For children with special needs, a comprehensive programme of class-based teacher support and/or input from external agencies/professionals is available.


As parents, you will be kept fully informed of your child's progress. The school will assess and report annually on your child's progress in:

- Areas of Learning;
- Cross-Curricular Skills; and
- Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities.

Mid-way during the first term parents are invited to a consultation with their child's class teacher to discuss their child's progress. A written report is issued in June of each year in which the performance of the child in each of the curricular areas is reported.

Parents are very welcome to contact the school to arrange additional meetings.







MEETING INDIVIDUAL NEEDS

We believe that every child should have the opportunity to succeed. Teachers, therefore, provide a programme of work for all children which is appropriate to their age and stage of development. We aim to identify specific learning difficulties or special talents as early as possible and cater for them. Annual screening takes place to ensure children are performing according to their ability. The school liaises closely with external agencies to support each child's individual needs and involves parents at all stages. Every effort will be made to provide maximum access to the curriculum for children with Special Educational Needs. Teachers will liaise closely with the pupil and parent in drawing up Personal Learning Plans (PLP) for their child and regular reviews of progress will be initiated. The school's Special Needs Policy is in line with the Education (NI) Order 1996. This enables the staff to fully implement the requirements of the Code of Practice on the Identification and Assessment of Special Educational Needs published by DENI



PASTORAL CARE

The Pastoral Care of the children in St. Mary's Primary School is of paramount importance. We aim to provide a happy, safe environment where each child will be given the opportunity to reach his/her true academic, social, emotional and spiritual potential. The primary objective of the school ethos is to ensure that pupils are shown consideration and respect and are encouraged and expected to treat others in the same way.

In St. Mary's we:

- Promote the children's self-esteem through praise and reward.
- Ensure each child feels that he/she is appreciated for their contribution to the life of the school.
- Provide children with a secure and happy environment where they feel safe and encouraged to learn.
- Ensure that each child is given the opportunity to experience success.
- Establish good partnerships with the parents and guardians and to work positively with other agencies including Health and Social Services, Clergy, Education Welfare Officer, RISE N.I, CAMHS and other educational bodies.

Class teachers strive to know each child in their care and to form positive and worthwhile links with parents and carers. Classroom assistants and ancillary staff help to ensure the safety and well-being of each child and to enhance their learning. Children are always encouraged to do their best and are regularly nominated for recognition of effort in the many areas of school life. Parents are welcome to discuss their children's progress and any other significant matters at any time.



PARENTAL AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Our school encourages a partnership approach between home, school and parish for the benefit of our pupils. St. Mary's benefits from a pro-active Board of Governors and an enthusiastic supportive Parent Support Group which organises fundraising events during each school year and supports the school in practical ways when requested. The school is an integral part of the community and Parish.



SCHOOL POLICIES

The Principal, Teaching Staff and Board of Governors of St. Mary's Primary School determine school policies in accordance with the guidance provided by the Department of Education. We have a range of policies and procedures in place which are made available to parents routinely and on request. Key policies are available to view in the parent area on the school website.



CHILD PROTECTION AND SAFEGUARDING

We in St. Mary's Cabragh have a responsibility for the Pastoral Care, general welfare and safety of the children in our care and we will carry out this duty by providing a caring, supportive and safe environment, where each child is valued for his or her unique talents and abilities, and in which all our young people can learn and develop to their full potential. All staff, teaching and non-teaching are alert to the signs of possible abuse and know the procedures to be followed.

AFTER-SCHOOL CLUBS

Pupils from P1-P7 may avail of a broad range of Afterschool activities in each term throughout the year. Visiting tutors, alongside existing staff, deliver and support activities such as Music, Basketball, Gardening, Coding, Arts & Crafts and Drama. All those who work with our pupils are vetted in line with Department of Education guidelines.



ENRICHED PROVISION

Our pupils have the opportunity to experience a range of extra-curricular activities. Le Club Français is a fun language club for children led by our French teacher, Mrs Diane Daly. The children learn French through songs, games, plays, stories and lots of fun activities. We also maximise the expertise and skills of individual teachers to extend children's experiences in STEM, ICT, Sport, Art, Drama and Mindfulness (The 'Relax Kids', programme is delivered by Mrs Paula Mc Gilligan and 'The Calm Kit', is delivered by Mrs Katie Carey). EA music tutors deliver weekly music lessons (strings, brass, drums and woodwind). Mrs Marina Mohan also delivers weekly traditional music lessons to Key Stage 2 pupils.





ATTENDANCE

Rates of attendance at St. Mary's Primary School are high and are felt to contribute greatly to pupils' academic performance. It is essential that your child attends school regularly and maintains a pattern of good attendance throughout their school career. Excellent attendance at school is important to allow a child or young person to fulfil their potential. The Absence Notification Form must be completed for each period of pupil absence and returned to the class teacher or school secretary on the child's return to school. In the interests of safety, parents should telephone the school if their child is going to be absent or late before 9:00 am. We deem this to be a most important safety procedure. The Education Welfare Officer regularly visits school to monitor attendance and punctuality





POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

We believe that a positive approach must be used in maintaining school discipline. Our approach will closely correspond to the aims of the school. We recognise that a consistent whole-staff approach to discipline is essential and that the Principal has a key role to play in ensuring that standards are maintained.

We will endeavour to:

- Provide a happy, caring and stimulating school environment.
- Treat children with fairness and consistency.
- Encourage good social and personal skills, self-respect and respect for others.
- Nurture self-esteem, confidence and independence.
- Develop in our pupils a set of moral and religious values in keeping with the Christian and Catholic ethos of the school.

The main elements of this approach will be:

- Good pupil-teacher relations.
- Engaged and stimulating learning.
- Classroom organisation.
- Teaching methods.
- An awareness of and sympathy towards the needs and requirements of individual pupils.
- Consistent encouragement and praise.

We aim to provide a well-ordered, disciplined, safe and caring environment for our pupils. We ask that parents co-operate with us to achieve this.



SCHOOL HOURS



School begins at 8:45 am.

Children may be dropped off at school from 8.30 am onwards.

It is very important for children to be on time for morning assembly and prayers at 8:45 am.

School finishes at:

1:30 pm for pupils in Primary 1;

1:40 pm for pupils in Primary 2 and

2:45 pm for pupils in Primary 3-7.

An After School Programme operates from $\underline{1:30~pm-2:45~pm}$ each day for pupils in $\underline{Primary}$ $\underline{1~and~Primary~2}$. Information on charges is available from school. Prompt collection of pupils at home-time is very much appreciated, as this allows staff to continue with planned school development work or meetings promptly.

VISITORS TO SCHOOL

All visitors to the school – including parents – are required to report to the Main Office if needing to pass on a message or to see or collect a child during the school day. This monitoring helps the school maintain Child Protection requirements by enabling us to know who is on the premises at any given time. All who work in school appreciate your cooperation with this important matter. All visitors including parents should not go beyond the school entrance foyer unless accompanied by a member of staff.





SCHOOL MEALS

School meals are cooked in the school kitchen and the canteen staff are committed to providing healthy and nutritious meals. School dinners can be booked and paid for via the School Money App. Prices are shared at the start of each school year and updated when needed. Menus are sent home at the start of each term and can be viewed on the school website.

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
HEALTHY BREAK/LUNCH

St Mary's Primary School promotes healthy eating at school. Lunch is an important meal for school going children. It should provide one third of their recommended daily allowance of nutrients without being high in fat, sugar or salt. It should also provide dietary fibre.

Convenience foods like crisps, sweets, biscuits, chocolate and soft drinks are not permitted. Children should bring a water bottle or milk to school. A healthy packed lunch should contain bread or an alternative, a savoury filling which provides protein and some fruit and/or vegetables. Growing children should get approximately one pint of milk a day, or its equivalent as cheese, yoghurt or milk pudding. This ensures that they get enough calcium, which is essential for healthy bones and teeth. If a child does not drink milk at lunch, encourage him or her to have a carton of yoghurt or a small helping of cheese. Packed lunches should be sent into school in a plastic lunch box, clearly labelled with your child's name.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: We have a large number of children with life threatening nut allergies. Please <u>DO NOT</u> send nuts to school with your child or foods that contain nuts.





HOMEWORK

Parents have a wide range of responsibilities in relation to their children and success depends greatly on liaison between home and school. In St. Mary's, we value co-operation with the parent or guardian. You, the parent, have an important part to play, especially in the area of homework. Homework is not only an essential part of our pupils' learning but is an opportunity for parents to become involved in their children's learning and progress.

Homework is reinforcement of work/learning done in school and is an excellent home/school link. Working together, with the pupil's best interest at heart, proves to be a most successful method of helping to educate your child. Parents are encouraged to sign all homework and reading records.

Children's homework will cover the full range of subjects as laid down in the N.I. Curriculum but will vary according to the needs and abilities of the children. The homework will include written, mental and oral work — children will be asked to read, learn tables and spellings, complete, set exercises in Maths and English as well as practising musical instruments.

If at any time your child is having difficulty with their homework, please inform the class teacher as soon as possible so that the matter may be addressed.
