Dear Parent/Guardian,

I hope you and your families are keeping safe and well in these worrying times.

The Department of Education has announced that schools will be closed for face to face teaching until at least Monday 8th March. The current high rates of infection and hospitalisation means that this continues to be necessary in the short term.

I would like to thank you all (both parents and pupils) for your fantastic engagement in Remote Learning. We know how difficult it is to juggle the demands of work and home schooling. It has also been fantastic to see the children engaging so well in the Feel Good Friday Health and Wellbeing challenges and to receive all the fabulous videos and photographs. Maintaining our sense of community and connection with the children is so important to us all in St. Mary's.

I would also like to pay tribute to all the staff in St. Mary's and thank them for their hard work and dedication. They have embraced new technology and are providing innovative, creative and high quality teaching and learning experiences for all the children via Google Classroom. The use of this platform in St. Mary's has provided opportunities to motivate the children, work collaboratively, give immediate feedback, keep the children engaged and enhance their learning experiences. We have been heartened by the positive feedback many of you have sent to us. Thank you everyone.

Remote Learning

Alongside Google Classroom, we also encourage the children to continue to work hard at developing their reading and comprehension skills. As you know the school has invested in the Big Cat e-Library reading scheme. Class teachers will set two guided reading books at the pupil's level for the week, P1-P5. Some Key Stage 2 classes are completing class novels at the minute as guided reading. It is important that the children also continue to engage with AR. Accelerated Reader pupils in P4-P7 have now completed their STAR reading test remotely and have received their new ZPD range for reading. Teachers have set new individual targets and these have been shared with the children. Term 2 ends on Friday 2nd April. Pupils need to reach their individual targets in order to receive their prize at Easter! Pupils in St. Mary's also have the opportunity to access the MyOn website to read non-fiction books. This site is linked to the AR site so pupils can take quizzes on books they have read. St Mary's has also invested in the online spelling programme called Wordshark. All pupils should have their usernames and passwords for this site. Please contact your class teacher should you need them.
